

The Château de Vincennes, which served as a royal residence from the 12th to the 18th century, has maintained its outer walls, its Sainte-Chapelle and its medieval keep.

From the start of the 16th century through to the 19th century the keep served as a prison, the symbol of a justice administered under a cloak of secrecy, and is still haunted today by the memories of the famous prisoners it housed, including Nicolas Fouquet, the Marquis de Sade and Mirabeau. The Sainte-Chapelle, on which work began in 1379, contains a remarkable decor and fulfilled Charles V's

dream of adding an extraordinary religious building to the fortress.
